The City budget serves as a communication device, a policy tool and a financial plan. The budget document is much more than just financial numbers.

As a communication device the budget allows the public to learn about the city's goals, priorities, mission statements, and financial policies. The City budget is a comprehensive document which captures information pertinent to the issues the City is looking to address or accomplish. For instance, capital projects, day to day operations, planning, staffing levels and even salary compensation. The budget transmittal letter along with the budget document provides information in an effort to be transparent to Citizens.

The City budget serves as a policy tool were City Council establishes written policies, goals, and spending allocation within the budget to accomplish the goals. The City budget contains departmental missions and goals, staffing, an organizational structure and narratives that highlight the scope of operations.

Finally, the City budget serves as a financial plan outlining estimated revenues and anticipated expenditures for all funds. The General Fund maintains the bulk of day to day departmental expenditures and, City is required to pass a balanced budget

These budget workshops will also be held with the use of teleconference and/or video conferencing capabilities due to the current public health emergency related to COVID-19. The City of Castle Hills City Hall is wheelchair accessible and accessible parking spaces are available.
